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FEBRUARY 2012: BE A CHRISTIAN! Let love be without hypocrisy or dissimulation. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another." (Romans 12:9&10)

Why would the Apostle Paul say; "Let love be without hypocrisy or dissimulation"? It would help for us to first understand what kind of love he is talking about in verse 9. It is the Greek word 'agape' which is translated love in verse 9. As you may know this word stresses the kind of love which proceeds from God, and is in fact the reason He gave God the Son to die upon the cross. How is God's way of loving or showing love? To put it simply, our Lord shows love without consideration to what kind of a person he or she may be, his/her ranking in society or how popular one may or may not be. This is the kind of love one finds in Christ Jesus. This love cannot be earned, bought or bartered for.

As a child of the Almighty, we must realize that this love is a high and holy calling. But, too often we are rebellious children and there are times we dig pits for ourselves that are so deep we feel we can never get out. I am reminded what Corrie Ten Boone said; "No pit is so deep, that God's love is not deeper still." When we feel that we have strayed too far to be helped, Psalm 139 reminds us that there is no place for His child to go where He is yet able to rescue and keep. "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? (Psalm 139:7)

You see, it is God's sovereign love which binds us to Him. Because our God is such a loving and keeping God, David responds by saying; "You have hedged me behind and before, and laid Your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high, I cannot attain it." (Psalm 139:5&6)

Now back to the question of hypocrisy and dissimulation. It is quite simple why Paul uses these in connection with God's love, and yet so many miss the simplicity of it. If we say that we love God and yet have great difficulty loving others, especially in the Church, something is definitely wrong with this equation. Paul would tell us that this is hypocrisy, and that we are feigning to be something when we are not. We are also hiding under a false mask and assimilating a false appearance.

Having brotherly love for those in the church and loving those outside of Christ is tied directly to how God's love has impacted our lives. If it has not impacted us, we will show partiality, we will exclude others from our small circles and we may view ourselves from a perspective that God does not. It may also indicate that we have not experienced the life changing love and power of God. As Christians, what we say must go hand-in-hand with the words we choose say and how we live.

We can never hope to impact our homes, let alone our society with the gospel of the Lord Jesus if we are operating under false pretenses. May we all fall upon the grace of our God and be changed by His life changing love that will fit us for His service.

Lord, we bend the knee of our stubborn wills to Your most holy and wise will. Please bring us into alignment with Your Word so we may be pleasing to You and helpful and encouraging to others.

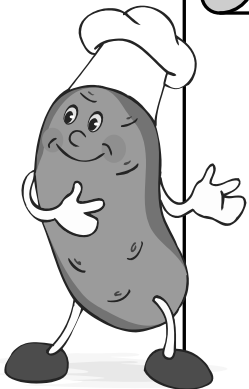
